From Fr. Peter's Desk
Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Dear Parish Family:

On this Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time, our first reading consists of a collection of wisdom sayings centered on the importance of trusting in God and the foolishness of turning away and trusting in human values. The imagery of a tree with deep roots is frequently used throughout the Old Testament to describe those who trust in God, because even in times of trouble, they will survive.

The Second Reading today is a small part of a longer teaching on the doctrine of bodily resurrection. In this section, St. Paul explains the consequences of not accepting this teaching. We know Christ was raised, Paul says, and, with him, all who trust in his name will be raised to new life.

In our Gospel, we hear of the Beatitudes, which are, in fact, about trust in God who cares for those who suffer. Jesus also includes a matching series of "woes" that focus on those who have turned away from God by refusing to do their part in alleviating these sufferings.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, trust is not easy to define in the abstract, but we know it when we see it. We also know that we must "take the leap," before something can be experienced. Today's readings invite us to take the leap and trust in the Lord who gives life. To be truly happy, we must have complete trust and dependence on God, in all circumstances of our daily lives, trusting that God will fulfill his promise in the greatness of His Kingdom.
