## From Fr. Peter's Desk Pentecost Sunday

Dear Parish Family:

Our First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles reminds us of the chaos that preceded the creation of our world. The people who began the Tower of Babel scattered in confusion. The mighty windows of Babel, on Mt. Sinai, blow with the force of creation. At last, the apostles would celebrate that new creation in the Holy Spirit.

In our Second Reading, St. Paul points out that the Holy Spirit comes to aid us in our weakness, acknowledging that even he is not strong enough to carry out the mission of evangelization by himself. We too ask the Holy Spirit for insight and understanding of how we can use our unique talents to carry out the Christian mission and then find the courage to go out and do so.

Our Gospel points out that the Holy Spirit came to the disciples, who were gathered together in one place. The disciples had all scattered like leaves in the wind when Jesus was crucified. They were afraid then and they were still afraid on Pentecost. Still they came together as one. Perhaps that was the work of the Spirit even before its manifestation. In the same way, the Holy Spirit draws us together today. Despite our various fears or concerns, we gather here as one to worship the Lord.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, the Holy Spirit comes to shed a ray of light divine. Let us pray that our wounds be healed, our hearts be strengthened, and the guilt of our sins washed away. Come Holy Spirit and renew the face of the earth!

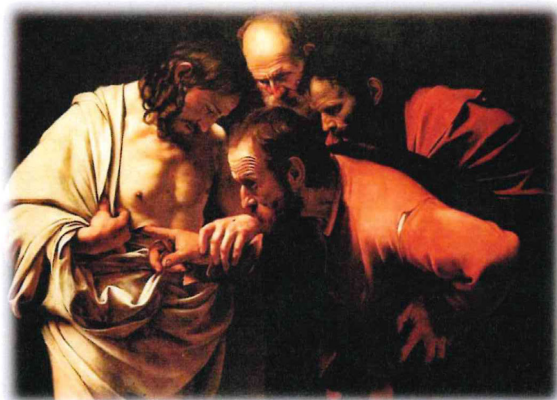
