From Fr. Peter's Desk
13th Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

Our reading today from the Book of Wisdom contrasts death with life. God, and the right relationship with God, are placed firmly on the side of life, drawing a lesson from Genesis' account of creation, in which God created us in his image. This reading tells us that God created human beings for eternal righteousness.

St. Paul counsels us to excel in graciousness, eschewing surplus and endeavoring for equality. We are all called to actualize this summons in our lives.

Today's Gospel from Mark presents one of his characteristic intercalations, a so called "sandwich story" where a complete event is sandwiched inside another episode. This parable has several lessons that can be ascertained when we reflect upon them together. Ultimately, Jesus heals or restores life to the woman afflicted with hemorrhaging and the young girl who seemed to be dead. Both the woman and the young girl's father show faith in Jesus, by asking for His help. Jesus shows no partiality to class or religious restrictions in His desire to heal and serve. Are we able to do the same thing?

My brothers and sisters in Christ, Jesus gives Jairus, and us, some seemingly simple advice in today's Gospel: "Do not be afraid; just have faith." When we are afflicted, it can be easy to be like those weeping and mourning the death of Jairus' daughter and ridicule Jesus as he calls us to not be afraid. But by cultivating a prayer life that strengthens us, we come to the realization that Christ will meet us and be with us as we experience hardships and afflictions. Let us pray for one another for the grace to be able to have that trust and faith in good times as well as in bad.

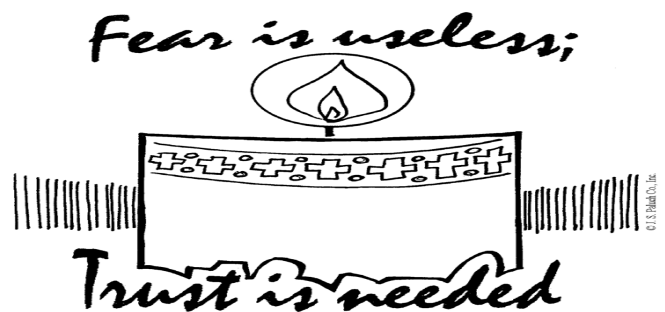

2023-24 RELIGIOUS ED SUMMARY REPORT

This past year (2023-2024), 122 people of St. Andrew’s and Queen of the Most Holy Rosary parishes, aged 6 to 55+ years, participated in faith formation in one of our programs. Many programs culminated in the reception of Sacraments of Initiation in the Catholic Church:

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (Baptism, Confirmation, First Eucharist)	1 person
RCIA (Confirmation of Adults)	2 people
RCIA (Confirmation of HS teens)	8 people
Confirmation Program (Middle School Students)	20 students
First Communion (Elementary Students)	19 students

It is no secret that our goal is to enhance the participation of every family at Sunday Mass. The Eucharist is source and summit of our parish life and all that we do as Catholics. At Mass, we hear God’s Word to be instructed and inspired. At Mass we receive Christ’s Body and Blood to be nourished and strengthened. The best way to form our young people and families in our faith is to come to Mass weekly and to participate in the Eucharist as fully as possible. As we move forward, our programs will direct the children and families to a greater and a more full participation at Sunday Mass.

I am personally grateful to Fr. Peter, Fr. Manuel, and Pastoral Minister Robert for their support and guidance these busy months in support of your children! They are most knowledgeable, kind, and generous. Finally, I cannot say enough about the amazing and generous work of the Catechists from our parish! They are volunteers who offer hours of service sharing the faith with our young people! So, to Margaret, Rhodi, Helen, Marguerite, Betsy, Steve, Carol, Ray and Paul: Thank You! Thank You! Thank You!

Please stay tuned and be sure to read our periodic emails and announcements going forward. During the summer months, we plan to consider some modifications to our program, such as:

- Recruitment and training more catechists (if interested, PLEASE contact me!!)
- Changes in registration process
- More effective Communication and Information sharing (including social media)
- Modifying the curriculum to a more family-based approach
- Moving all in person classes to Sunday mornings for all levels, on alternating weeks, with “hybrid” instruction both in-person AND online)
- More active participation of children and families at the 10:45AM Mass at St. Andrew’s
