MARRIAGES:

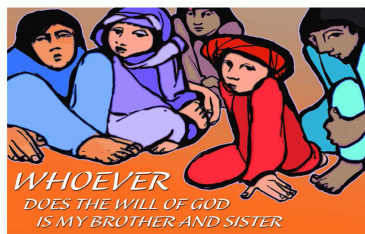
Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

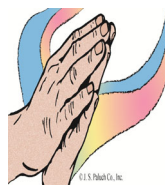

From Fr. Peter's Desk
Tenth Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

Today's Genesis narrative recounts the consequences of humankind's disobedience to God. Both the man and the woman were led to forsake the covenant by the cunning serpent. Adam and Eve both fail to take responsibility for their actions, Adam blaming both the woman and God and Eve blaming the serpent. As the reading continues, we learn of the consequences. Relationships with one another and with creation have been disordered by these early choices.

As we all know, the older we get the more difficult it is to do what we did in our 20's and 30's. Eventually, we start losing the ability to do certain things altogether. Let St. Paul's words give us hope. Though "our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day." Physically we may be weakening, but spiritually we are given the opportunity daily to grow stronger. By our prayer and study of God's word, we strive to follow God's will, thus knowing that our dwelling in God's kingdom will last forever.

In disputing the scribes' absurd contention that Jesus is able to drive out demons because he is possessed by the prince of demons, Jesus warns of blaspheming against the Holy Spirit. He implies that it is the Holy Spirit that allows Him to drive out the unclean spirits. We received that same Holy Spirit in baptism and so have the Holy Spirit within us. May we use the power of the Holy Spirit in us to drive out the demons who threaten to destroy our lives.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, moved by the Holy Spirit, we gather as a family, a parish family, as well as children of God-to celebrate the Eucharist. May we always be conscious of our closeness to God, who calls out to us gentle each day to do his will, on earth as it is in heaven.

2023-24 RELIGIOUS ED SUMMARY REPORT

This past year (2023-2024), 122 people of St. Andrew’s and Queen of the Most Holy Rosary parishes, aged 6 to 55+ years, participated in faith formation in one of our programs. Many programs culminated in the reception of Sacraments of Initiation in the Catholic Church:

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (Baptism, Confirmation, First Eucharist)	1 person
RCIA (Confirmation of Adults)	2 people
RCIA (Confirmation of HS teens)	8 people
Confirmation Program (Middle School Students)	20 students
First Communion (Elementary Students)	19 students

It is no secret that our goal is to enhance the participation of every family at Sunday Mass. The Eucharist is source and summit of our parish life and all that we do as Catholics. At Mass, we hear God’s Word to be instructed and inspired. At Mass we receive Christ’s Body and Blood to be nourished and strengthened. The best way to form our young people and families in our faith is to come to Mass weekly and to participate in the Eucharist as fully as possible. As we move forward, our programs will direct the children and families to a greater and a more full participation at Sunday Mass.

I am personally grateful to Fr. Peter, Fr. Manuel, and Pastoral Minister Robert for their support and guidance these busy months in support of your children! They are most knowledgeable, kind, and generous. Finally, I cannot say enough about the amazing and generous work of the Catechists from our parish! They are volunteers who offer hours of service sharing the faith with our young people! So, to Margaret, Rhodi, Helen, Marguerite, Betsy, Steve, Carol, Ray and Paul: Thank You! Thank You! Thank You!

Please stay tuned and be sure to read our periodic emails and announcements going forward. During the summer months, we plan to consider some modifications to our program, such as:

- Recruitment and training more catechists (if interested, PLEASE contact me!!)
- Changes in registration process
- More effective Communication and Information sharing (including social media)
- Modifying the curriculum to a more family-based approach
- Moving all in person classes to Sunday mornings for all levels, on alternating weeks, with “hybrid” instruction both in-person AND online)
- More active participation of children and families at the 10:45AM Mass at St. Andrew’s
