MARRIAGES:

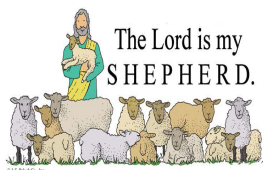
Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

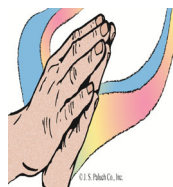

From Fr. Peter’s Desk
16th Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading, Jeremiah denounces the shepherds of Israel, who have driven the faithful away. He prophesies that the Lord will raise up a successor to David, who will shepherd wisely and justly. We believe that this prophecy points to none other than Jesus.

St. Paul, in his letter to the Ephesians, continues his teaching in terms of peace, and the access to peace that disciples seeking relationship to God the Father manifest through interactive, conciliatory relationship with one another.

Our Gospel passage from Mark encapsulates the teaching of the prophet Jeremiah. God sees the needs of the people and promises to send a righteous branch of David to Shepherd the lost sheep, bringing them into justice and right relationship with God. Jesus is the Good Shepherd, who will see to our security through all of life’s challenges, even unto death.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, in our Gospel reading, the apostles and Jesus gather as a community and share their ministry with each other. After listening to them, Jesus encourages them to retreat. Consider how much, like the disciples, it can be to easily become absorbed by the business of our lives, Jesus reminds us that we must prioritize spending intentional time with God. This is critical as it helps us to see the Lord at our side, guiding us even when we walk in the dark valley. If you are unable to attend a formal retreat, take some extra time during your week and meditate on the wonders and strength of God and of how much you are loved by Him.

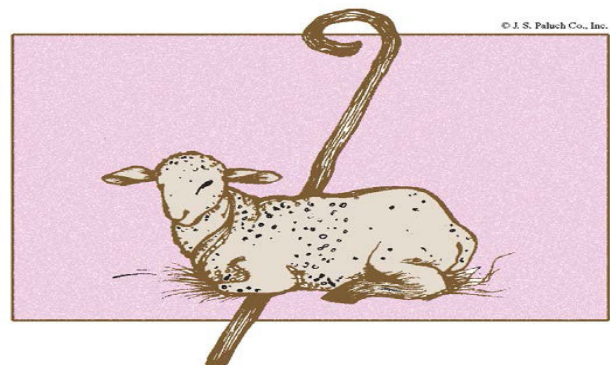

2023-24 RELIGIOUS ED SUMMARY REPORT

This past year (2023-2024), 122 people of St. Andrew’s and Queen of the Most Holy Rosary parishes, aged 6 to 55+ years, participated in faith formation in one of our programs. Many programs culminated in the reception of Sacraments of Initiation in the Catholic Church:

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (Baptism, Confirmation, First Eucharist)	1 person
RCIA (Confirmation of Adults)	2 people
RCIA (Confirmation of HS teens)	8 people
Confirmation Program (Middle School Students)	20 students
First Communion (Elementary Students)	19 students

It is no secret that our goal is to enhance the participation of every family at Sunday Mass. The Eucharist is source and summit of our parish life and all that we do as Catholics. At Mass, we hear God’s Word to be instructed and inspired. At Mass we receive Christ’s Body and Blood to be nourished and strengthened. The best way to form our young people and families in our faith is to come to Mass weekly and to participate in the Eucharist as fully as possible. As we move forward, our programs will direct the children and families to a greater and a more full participation at Sunday Mass.

I am personally grateful to Fr. Peter, Fr. Manuel, and Pastoral Minister Robert for their support and guidance these busy months in support of your children! They are most knowledgeable, kind, and generous. Finally, I cannot say enough about the amazing and generous work of the Catechists from our parish! They are volunteers who offer hours of service sharing the faith with our young people! So, to Margaret, Rhodi, Helen, Marguerite, Betsy, Steve, Carol, Ray and Paul: Thank You! Thank You! Thank You!

Please stay tuned and be sure to read our periodic emails and announcements going forward. During the summer months, we plan to consider some modifications to our program, such as:

- Recruitment and training more catechists (if interested, PLEASE contact me!!)
- Changes in registration process
- More effective Communication and Information sharing (including social media)
- Modifying the curriculum to a more family-based approach
- Moving all in person classes to Sunday mornings for all levels, on alternating weeks, with “hybrid” instruction both in-person AND online)
- More active participation of children and families at the 10:45AM Mass at St. Andrew’s
