MARRIAGES:

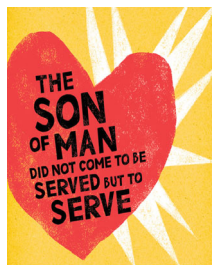
Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

From Fr. Peter's Desk 29th Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

Today's First Reading is from the final song of Isaiah's "Suffering Servant". We learn that although God crushes the servant with pain, God's plan is ultimately accomplished through him. Indeed, the suffering of God's Chosen One produces an offering of reparation and atonement that brings light and justifies all whose sins He bears.

In our Second reading from the Letter to the Hebrews, we learn that, as God's chosen high priest, Jesus is the one who has been tested in every way, the one who, without sin, bears the sins of all humankind. Through the model of Jesus, we strive to be our best selves, knowing that God's mercy will be with us even when we fail.

Mark's Gospel follows Jesus' third prediction of His passion. Jesus, through the suffering of His crucifixion and death, is thus presented as God's Suffering servant. Jesus teaches that His true disciples serve others as He does by sacrificing Himself.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, today, as we celebrate World Mission Sunday, let us remember that we all participate in the Christian mission by virtue of our baptism. In baptism, we promise to follow Christ and to put our faith into practice. One way that we do this is by carrying out the mission of the Church, to serve our brothers and sisters and bring the light of Christ to all. Let us pray that each one of us has the strength and courage to do our part in God's plan of Salvation.

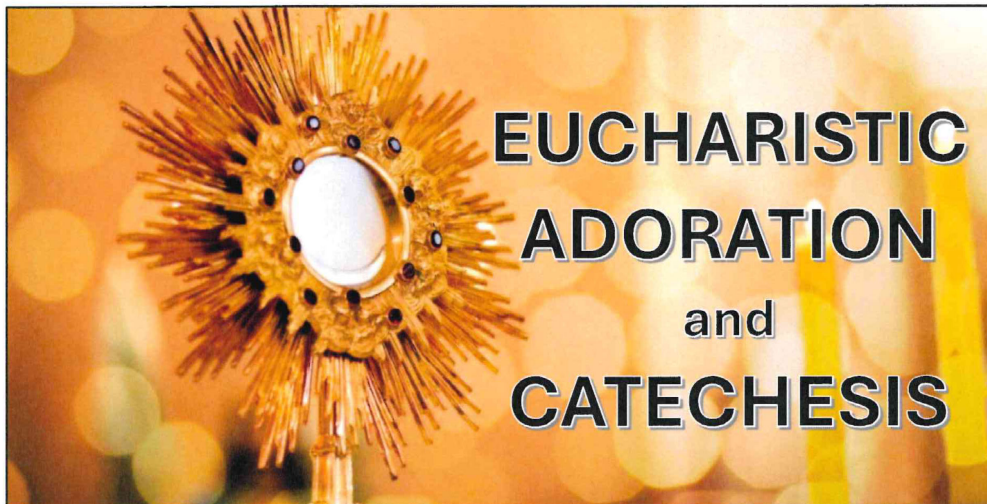
Retrouvaille A Lifeline for Married Couples

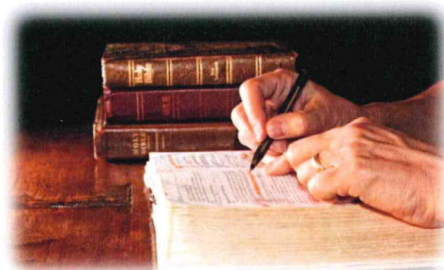
