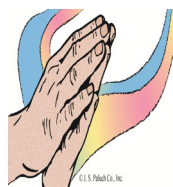

From Fr. Peter's Desk 30th Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

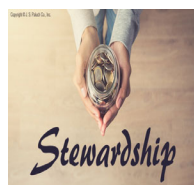
In 538BC, the Kingdom of Judah was overrun, and God's people were deported to all parts of the Babylonian Empire. The Israelites wondered if they would ever return to their homeland and traditions of culture and worship. In our First reading of today, the prophet Jeremiah affirms God's power and plan to restore the faithful. Present suffering is not the end. The faithful ultimately dwell in peaceful union with God.

Our Second Reading from the Letter to the Hebrews, expresses a particular understanding of Jesus Christ as a priest in the line of Aaron and Melchizedek, two holy figures in the Old Testament. The reading presents Jesus as just such a holy figure, in intimate relationship with God, who acts in service on behalf of the people.

Today's Gospel reading meets Jesus and his disciples leaving Jericho on their journey to Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover and experience Jesus' passion. Although the ensuing miracle involving the regaining of physical sight of Bartimaeus focuses around Bartimaeus being blind, he already has all the sight that he needs to know who Jesus is and how God is calling him to live.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, today's readings highlight the joy of sight and the joy that comes from following Jesus. Though we may "go forth weeping" (Psalm 126:6) or stumble along the way, we indeed carry seeds that we must choose to sow. Jesus is our companion as we work to reap joy found only in following Him.

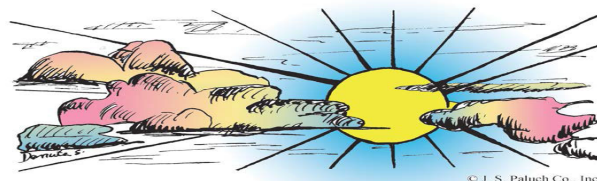

Retrouvaille A Lifeline for Married Couples

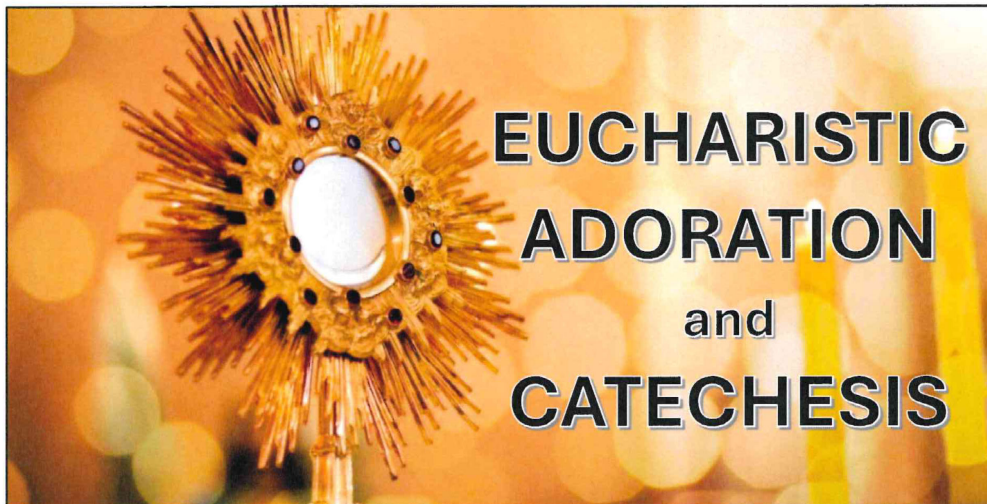

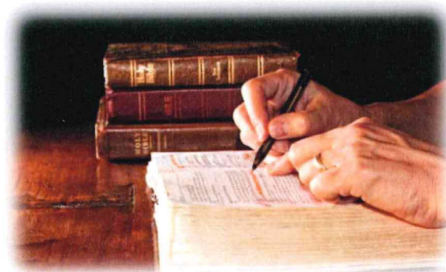
