**From Fr. Peter’s Desk**  
**32nd Sunday In Ordinary Time**

Dear Parish Family:

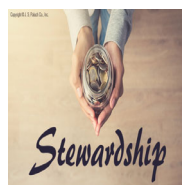
Both the prophet Elijah and the widow he encounters in our First Reading, mark their lives by God’s presence. Elijah is shown responding in kind to the poor woman’s faith and hospitality as she gives to him despite her dire need. God works through them both as they provide for each other. The true miracle of the never-empty jar is the relationship that emerges and the lives that bloom.

The author of Hebrews affirms that God brings salvation to all humankind through the sacrifice of Christ as the offering that atones for sin for all time. We hear, in this second reading, that God has particular concern for those with whom society often shuns, such as immigrants, people who are poor, and others bowed down by the weight of this world.

In our Gospel from St. Mark, Jesus continues this teaching. Jesus exposes the emptiness and impotence of those who are more concerned with status than where they stand in relationship with God and fellow human beings.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, Jesus challenges us to consider how we might be like the scribes, who led a community and were complicit in the suffering and poverty of their neighbors. The point to our scripture reading is not to condone living in poverty, but rather to ask ourselves how we can give from our surplus.

# MARCH FOR LIFE

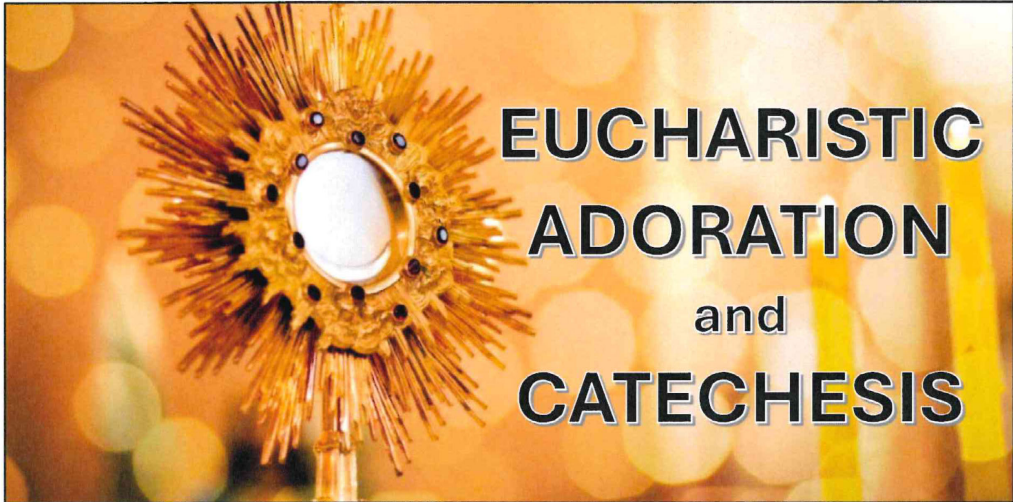


All are encouraged to attend the annual March for Life in Washington DC.
