MARRIAGES:

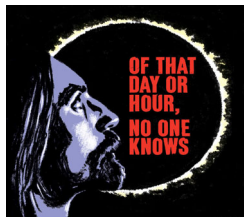
Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

33rd Sunday In Ordinary Time

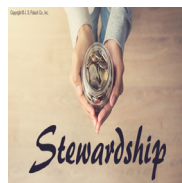
Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading today from the Prophet Daniel, Daniel reveals the climax of God's work in history. In apocalyptic form, the passage comforts the afflicted through imagery of heavenly battle and earthly recompense. Creation has a purposeful beginning, middle and end. Where science affirms the finiteness of nature; faith affirms that it has a purpose. What new belief that comes out of Daniel 12 is that those who hold these tenants can transcend death. What Daniel 12 declares without apology is that God acts. And in the end, our recompense is just.

Jesus, in today's Gospel, reiterates the importance of paying attention. Jesus encourage his disciples to learn from the growth of the fig tree. In a similar way, we can see the ways God is present in our lives each day, encouraging us to be like the wise who "shine brightly" and those who lead the many to justice.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, God challenges us to feel his presence in all of our surroundings. Sometime this week, go outside to take a walk. Challenge yourself to silence potential distractions, such as technology. As you walk, take note of your surroundings. Are we able to feel or notice God's presence? Aside from your walk, spend intentional time in prayer throughout the week to cultivate a relationship with God that radiates delight and trust.
