MARRIAGES:

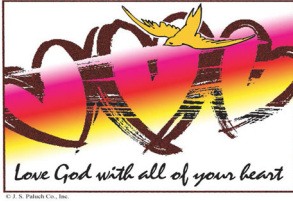
Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

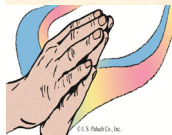

From Fr. Peter’s Desk
31st Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

Deuteronomy 6, our First Reading for today, expresses the essence of Israel’s covenant relationship with God. Moses calls God’s people to embody the decrees that will bear fruit for generations to come. Foundational to this relationship of faith and vocation is love. Our love for God, ourselves, and others makes possible community-living in unity with God and one another.

Our Gospel reading reinforces how we are to love God, “with all your heart, with all your soul and all your mind, and with all your strength”. We should love God with all of our available resources, with our whole person. Once we realize that every person is made in the image of God, it follows that we should love our neighbor as we love ourselves, for each of us is made in God’s image.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, this Sunday we are invited to reflect on how we embody these commandments of love of God and our neighbor. Though to the point and seemingly simple, living these commandments can be a challenge in our daily lives. It is important to reflect on how we can love God with all of our heart and to see Christ in the different people that we meet. Let us ask God for that grace, the grace to be able to love with our whole being, the grace to recognize that is how God loves us.

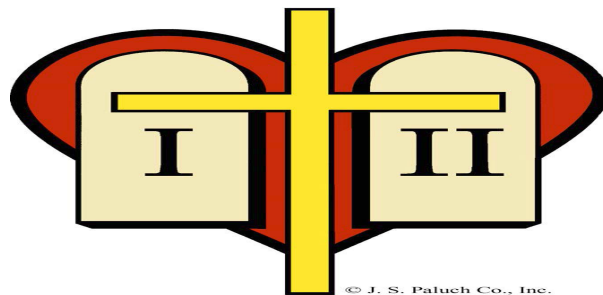

Proposal One - Ballot initiative to amend the NY State Constitution

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ:

As you may know, on the back of this year's general election ballot, you are asked to vote regarding a proposed amendment to the New York State Constitution.

Known as "Proposal One," if approved, this amendment would make it illegal under the New York State Constitution for any institution, public or private, to discriminate against an individual based upon such person's so-called "gender identity" or "gender expression."

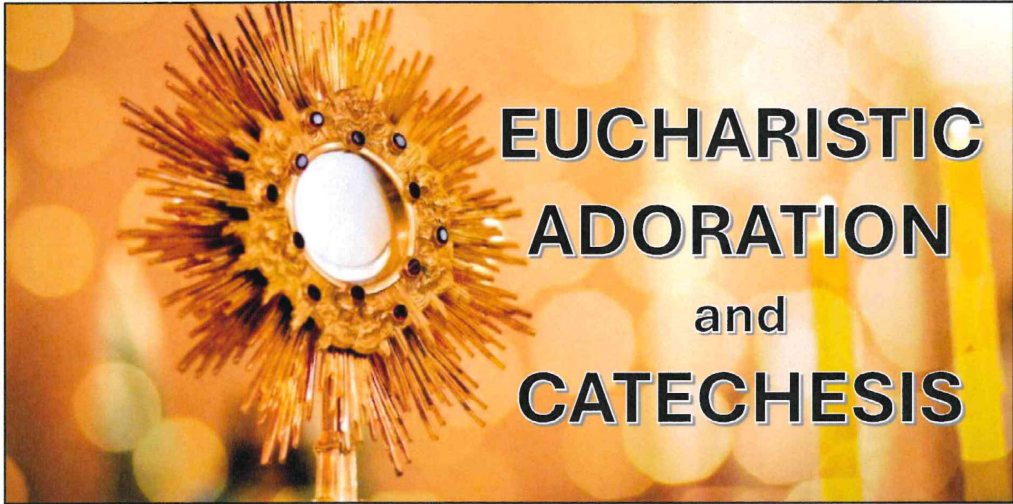
The creation of a new constitutional right based upon gender identity and expression would have far-reaching negative implications for Catholic parishes, schools and health care facilities, as well as for secular institutions such as local and youth sports teams, gyms and restaurants.

The amendment contains broad and vague language that is supposed to prevent discrimination based upon "reproductive healthcare and autonomy." These terms could be read by courts to require Catholic health care facilities to perform abortions because the refusal to do so could be construed as a form of illegal discrimination against a person's "reproductive autonomy."

The religious liberty of the Church is, therefore, directly threatened, as this proposal could be used to force Catholic institutions to employ persons, or to engage in practices, that are manifestly contrary to the Church's teachings. Failure to adhere to these practices will expose our parishes, schools and hospitals to lawsuits for unconstitutional discrimination.

I ask you to visit the diocesan website, drvc.org, to read Bishop Barres' letter on Proposal One and to view a short video of his recent remarks on the matter.

In union with all the bishops of New York, Bishop Barres asks that all of us inform our consciences on this issue. Proposal One is a threat to our religious liberty and should be voted down in this year's election.
