### **MARRIAGES:**

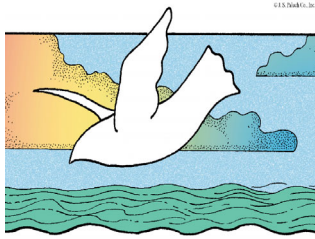
Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

**From Fr. Peter's Desk**  
**The Baptism of The Lord**

Dear Parish Family:

Today's First Reading and our Gospel reading both feature nearly the same words from God. Isaiah says God proclaims "Here is . . . my chosen one with whom I am pleased." When Jesus was baptized, the Father spoke from heaven, "you are my beloved Son: with you I am well pleased." Isaiah heralds' good news to the Jewish people, speaking of God's chosen one bringing justice to the nations, but not in the way we would expect. He will not establish justice through violent battles or grand gestures. This person will act quietly and tenderly. The person he refers to, of course, is Jesus Christ.

My brothers and sisters, we have been baptized in Christ. We are God's beloved children, baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. God continues to shower us with grace, a was poured down on us in a special way in baptism. Our baptism washed away sin, but it did so that we might take up Christ's mission. We have become a new creation when God sends us the same Spirit. Perhaps this New Year is a time to take that mission up in a new way, and to be a herald of glad tidings to all who are weary. Let us pray for God's grace to become missionaries to one another.

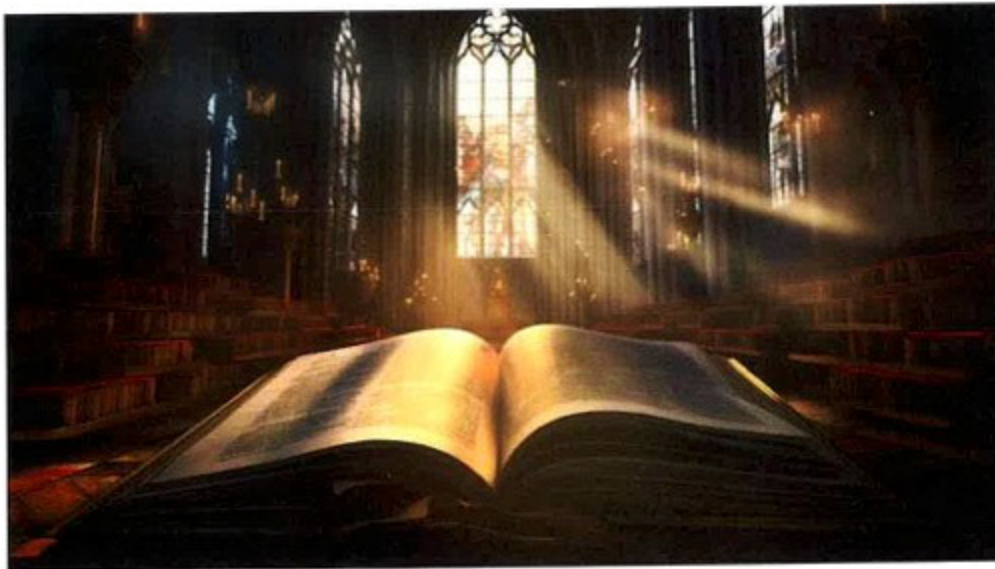

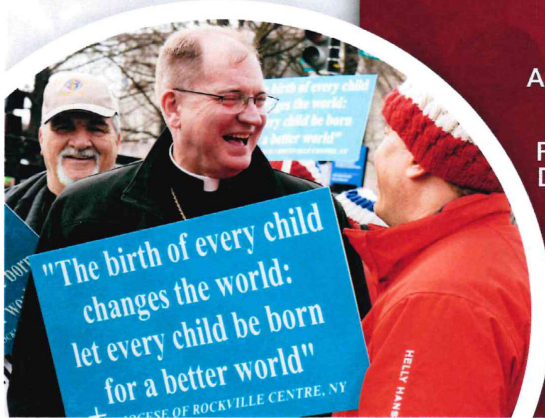
