MARRIAGES:

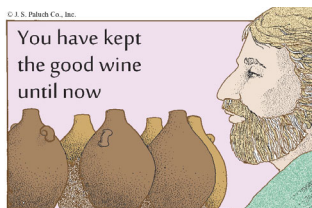
Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

From Fr. Peter's Desk
Second Sunday in
Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

In today's First Reading from the Prophet Isaiah, Isaiah celebrates a transformed Jerusalem; what had been forsaken and desolate is now delightful and foreshadowing the Gospel-espoused. St. Paul, in our Second Reading, goes into detail about the different kinds of spiritual gifts the Holy Spirit shares with us. He also mentions the different workings God produces in us and the different forms of service we do for the Lord. For Paul, the gifts of the Spirit and our service to the Lord are intertwined.

The account of Jesus changing water into wine is found only in John's Gospel. John referred to Jesus' miracles as signs, as a way for Him to reveal His glory and a way for those who observe them to receive the gift of faith. This miracle foreshadows one of His final signs, when he transforms bread into His Body and wine into His Blood at the Last Supper. Just as the joy of the guests of the wedding banquet in Cana was not allowed to run out, the joy we share in the Eucharistic banquet will also last forever.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, we are fortunate to be here and to celebrate our Mass, which culminates with the Body and Blood of Jesus. Filled with this loving gift, we are called to constant conversion, always changing for the better, always coming closer and closer to God through His son Jesus. Let us use the gifts that God gave us to spread the love that we share each time we receive Jesus through the Most Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist. Filled with a love that cannot be found anywhere else, we go forth and live the message of the Gospels, sharing the Good News with all that we come into contact with.

The Rosary Group

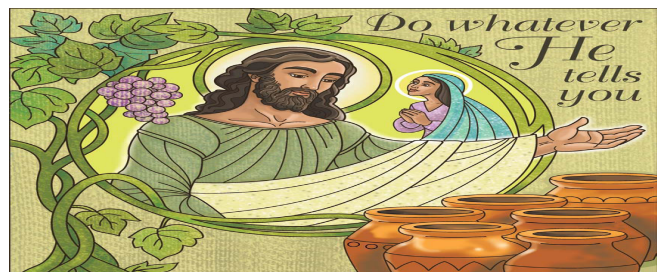

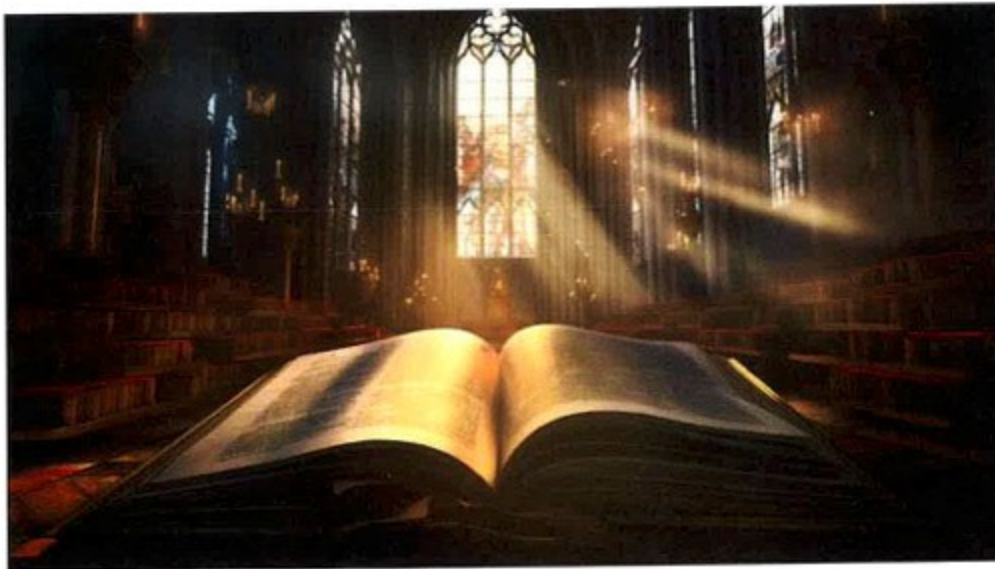
