From Fr. Peter's Desk

The 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading, the Prophet Jeremiah contrasts those who place their trust in humanity and those who place their trust in God by using nature to make an analogy. Those who misplace their trust are like a bush that is dry, stagnant, and barren while those who trust God are like a tree that constantly grows, thrives and bears fruit.

St. Paul, in our Second Reading, reminds us that our belief in the resurrection gives us the hope that we may live eternally in the kingdom of God. Jesus lived utterly dependent on God's grace, and this complete self-offering was the act of love that carried Him past death. When we, his disciples, live the same way, we too can catch a glimpse of the same eternal life.

In today's Gospel, Jesus is calling his audience to live by a different set of values. Then, as now, people naturally valued wealth and happiness and sufficiency. But Jesus tells them just the opposite. It is the poor who will inherit the kingdom of God. It is the hungry, the grief-stricken and the maligned who will "rejoice and leap for joy." This radical, countercultural call to his disciples then is his radical, countercultural call to us disciples now.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, Jesus teaches us today about the Kingdom of God, our eternal hope. God's values are not society's values. Whose values do we imitate? Let us pray that we may align our values with those of God's kingdom and live them out in bringing Jesus' Good News to those in need.


