From Fr. Peter's Desk
The 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

When they are called by the Lord, Isaiah, Paul and Peter initially insist that they are unworthy. After Isaiah calls himself unclean, an angel touches his mouth with an ember from the altar, purging him of his sin. Paul tells of how he persecuted many in the early church but was still called to conversion. Although Jesus does not explicitly absolve Peter of his sins, he responds to Peter's protestations by saying, "Do not be afraid" (Lk 5:10), reassuring him that his sinfulness is not a deal-breaker. He wants Peter to be a fisher of others, despite his being a sinful man.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, today we hear how three key figures in the Bible, Isaiah, Paul and Peter, are called. God calls Isaiah in a vision and Paul points out that Jesus appeared to him only after calling hundreds of disciples. Jesus calls Simon Peter after performing a miracle. Though all three go on to great things on the Lord's behalf, each initially feels unworthy of their call. Only after being reassured do they respond affirmatively. We may well feel unworthy ourselves of a call to join Jesus on his mission. Let us consider how we can still respond as Isaiah did: "Here I am . . . Send me."
