**From Fr. Peter's Desk  
The 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Dear Parish Family:

We begin our journey into God's word today with some ancient proverbs, collected by Sirach to teach morality. What we say and what we do reveal the kind of person we are.

St. Paul, in his letter to the Corinthians, explains that because of Jesus, sin has been defeated, and death cannot win in the end. St. Paul tells us to be fully devoted to the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord our labor is not in vain.

Today's Gospel has a lot to say about our eyes and our brothers or sisters' eyes. But what about God's eyes. Over the last few weeks, we have heard Jesus teaching his disciples how to see the world through God's eyes. Jesus has been reminding us that God does not see poor people as misfortunate, but as the inheritors of the kingdom. Those who are hungry, grieving or maligned will end up joyful. God sees us stumbling from the wooden beam in our eye and wants us to be healthy and whole.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, it's very easy to be judgmental but today's Gospel acts like a warning. The Gospel offers an alternative. Refocus. When it comes to ailing's, look in the mirror, not out to the world. Examine our consciences. If we do so honestly, we can identify how to improve ourselves and the way we see others. Let us strive for that grace during this upcoming Lenten season, a time which we are called to conversion, to see ourselves and to change what we need to change to be more in line with who God wants us to be. For this we pray!
