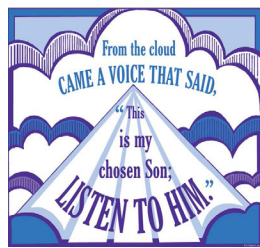
Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

**From Fr. Peter’s Desk**  
**Second Sunday of Lent**

Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading from the Book of Genesis, we hear about a very dramatic occurrence. God seals the covenant with Abram by appearing as smoke and fire and passing between the animals Abram had sacrificed as a sign of his covenant with God. The ritual that we hear about symbolized the seriousness of the covenant.

In our Second Reading from St. Paul, Paul’s belief that Christ “changes our lowly body to conform with his glorified body” becomes reality when we become Jesus’ hand, heart, and voice, and bear his light into a world that longs to see it.

Today’s Gospel reading has deep biblical roots. Christ’s moment of glorification does not occur to intimidate the disciples or exalt Jesus. Instead, the divine voice proclaims: “This is my chosen Son”; listen to Him.” Jesus’ glorification reinforces the humility and mercy that he has preached all along. Especially during Lent, we are called to set down the things that distract us and live the Gospel with greater fervor. Opportunities for mercy and forgiveness will catch our attention and perhaps, we will find the courage to respond.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, the transfiguration of Jesus reveals how a human being looks when completely transformed in the love of God. During the act of prayer, Jesus became luminous with God’s presence. Prioritize time for daily prayer during lent. Building a new prayer life is a surefire way to grow in our relationship with God.

**The Rosary Group**

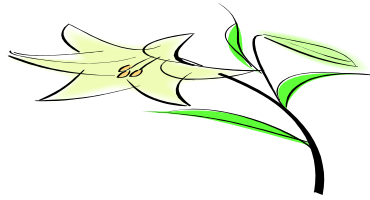
