MARRIAGES:

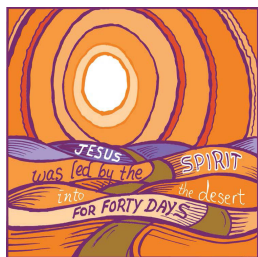
Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

First Sunday of Lent

Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading on this First Sunday of Lent, we hear from Deuteronomy, one of the First Five Books in the Old Testament. In this selection, we hear Moses reminding the people that God rescued them from bondage and led them to a “land flowing with milk and honey”. Times weren’t always good, but by remaining faithful, God carried them through their hardship and suffering. St. Paul, in his letter to the Romans, assures the Romans that all who confess their faith and seek help from the Lord will be saved!

Our Gospel today tells the story of Jesus’ 40 days and nights in the desert, but He is not alone. He goes there immediately after being baptized and thus the Holy Spirit is with Him. The Holy Spirit accompanies Jesus through His hunger, hardship and temptation. We too walk with the Holy Spirit, ready to help us resist temptation, endure hardship and avoid despair.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, like Jesus, we must put our faith and trust in God, especially when we are suffering or going through hardships. Enter into faith filled prayer with God and the Holy Spirit, ask Jesus to lead us through whatever troubles we are experiencing. The Holy Trinity is there for us, we just need to reach out in trust and love.

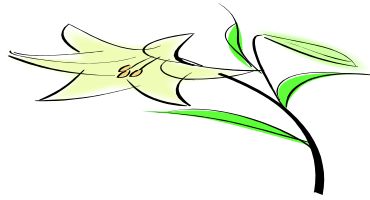
by the Rosary and Chaplet. Also on Saturdays at 9:30AM we meet to pray the Rosary. All are welcome.
