From Fr. Peter's Desk Fifth Sunday of Lent

Dear Parish Family:

A consistent theme in the Scriptures is God's ability to act in ways that transcend human imagination. In our First reading, the old ways of sin, war and conquest have given way to redemption and hope for new life.

St. Paul also knows this; his past troubled him, and he speaks often of his total dependence on God's mercy, as we hear in our Second reading from Paul's letter to the Philippians.

Our Gospel today reminds us that we cannot know the heart of another human being. It is given for us to reflect on at this point in Lent because of its proclamation of compassion and mercy. Fast from judging others; seek instead to view people with the eyes of compassion, as modeled by Jesus.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, as we approach Holy Week, we too can let ourselves be surprised with mercy and grace, knowing that God has provided for our salvation. Neither the cross nor death is the end. Therefore, we can be pilgrims of hope, confident that our journeys through Lent and through life will not end in death, but in new life. May our hope for salvation encourage us as we approach the holiest week of the year.

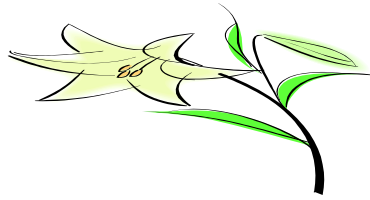

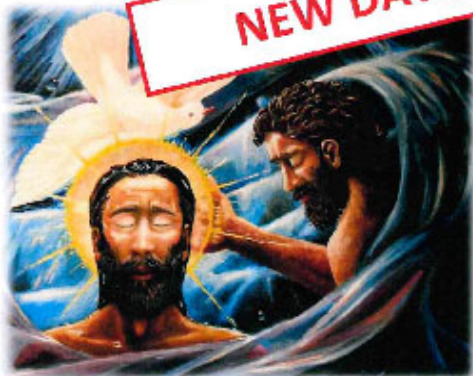
